- Increase your ability to educate students while meeting standards
- Learn to integrate activities from our Watershed Education Curriculum into your classroom
- Create Bay-specific lesson plans using field trips and expertise from staff and workshop participants

- Classroom teachers of grades 5 through 12 receive a stipend of \$200; Environmental Educators participate at no cost
- Optional **Continuing Education Unit** from Dominican University of California available for a \$45 processing fee
- Participants must attend **all three days** of the workshop
- The workshop is designed for middle and high school teachers (**Grades 5 through 12**)
