DAY ONE (6/28): CANOES IN SLOUGHS

- Engage in an on-site wetland restoration project
- Learn how to provide environmental service-learning for your students

DAY THREE (6/30): DESIGN A LESSON PLAN

- Increase your ability to educate students while meeting standards
- Learn to integrate activities from our Watershed Education Curriculum into your classroom
- Create Bay-specific lesson plans using field trips and expertise from staff and workshop participants

- Classroom teachers of grades 5 through 12 receive a stipend of \$100
- Optional Continuing Education Unit from Dominican University of California available for a \$45 processing fee
- Participants must attend all three days of the workshop
- The workshop is designed for middle and high school teachers (Grades 5 through 12)
